What happens at an Environmental Learning Program (ELP)?

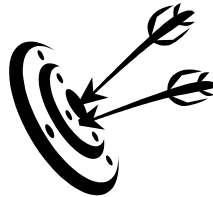

- Canoeing

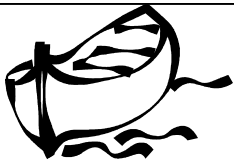
Discovery Activities

Who Comes To An ELP Event?

Schools looking to provide students 4th grade to 8th grade with an opportunity to learn more about God's creation in the unique setting of a Christian camp.

The program is dedicated to providing schools with a self-contained experiential environmental education programs that enable students to grow in the Christian Faith, gain a deeper understanding of God's creation and Grow in their understanding of their role as stewards of His creation.

At the end of the day, the students have a balance between, learning, fun, and time reflecting on God's Word. Use this as an opportunity to build relationships among the students and even build in an assessment tool.

What Do You Need To Do?

- Call and register for available dates. Programs can be one, two, three or more nights in length.
- Provide adult supervision at a ration of 1 adult per 10 Students.
- Cost is dependant upon length of stay. Fees apply to all participants (students, teachers, and adults) and is based on a per person rate.

How To Register

Contact the camp office by phone for additional information (information packets containing lesson samples etc. are available), to check availability of dates, and to make a reservation. A \$200 non-refundable deposit and a signed Reservation Agreement must be on file to guarantee your reservation. Once a reservation is made, the Camp Omega staff will be in contact to develop a schedule to meet your specific needs and clarify any details.
