

## CALLED

**Verse of the Day** - Exodus 3:12a “And God said, ‘I will be with you. And this will be the sign to you that it is I who have sent you.’”

**Take Away** - You can share God’s love, grace, and good news with the people He has called you to no matter how important, or unimportant, you feel.

God sent Moses a sign through a burning bush. He was able to see and feel the presence of God. Some ways that we can feel God’s presence is through friends and family. This craft will help us keep them close and feel their presence even when it may not feel like it.

### Project One: Rock Photo Holders

#### Materials:

- Rock
- Paint
- Paintbrushes
- Wire (or pipe cleaners)
- Beads

#### Create!

1. Find a rock and paint it in any way you would like.
2. Take a piece of wire or your pipe cleaner, and wrap it around your rock making sure that it is tightly secured.
3. With the rest of the pipe cleaner sticking up, add as many beads as you want.
4. Twist the top of the wire or pipe cleaner around a marker or other writing utensil 2-3 times until it reaches the beads.
5. Place any image in between the spirals and place somewhere to admire.

## Project Two: Whirlygig

### Materials:

- Recycled cardboard
- String
- Glue
- Scissors
- Markers
- Construction paper
- A kitchen skewer or sharpened pencil



### Create!

1. Taking your recycled cardboard, cut out two identical circles roughly 4-5in. in diameter.
2. Taking construction paper, cut out two circles that will match the size of your cardboard circles.
3. Glue your two cardboard circles together, and then glue a paper circle on both sides of the now one circle.
4. Draw a tree trunk on the top half of the circle and fire on the bottom half. When they spin, it will look like the bush is on fire! Just like for Moses!
5. With a kitchen skewer or sharpened pencil, poke two holes in the center of the circle to make it look like a giant button.
6. Cut a piece of string and loop it through the two holes, as if you were to wear it as a necklace.
7. Once dry, place the cardboard in the center of the string, wind it up, and gently pull on the string to watch it go!
